Horsham District Council is committed to supporting older people in a variety of ways, including:

The Council's older people's strategy 'Preparing for an Ageing Population' recognises that by 2026, the number of over 65 year olds living in the Horsham District will increase by 60%. Some older people will be able to lead active, independent lives, while 18% of residents aged 65 or older would be considered vulnerable. The strategy responds to the views of older people as expressed through the principles of 'Life is for Living' and the Horsham District Older Peoples Forum, as well as other consultation mechanisms. We aim to promote the empowerment and wellbeing of older people through these services. We work in partnership with a number of statutory and voluntary organisations to develop projects and activities to meet the needs of older people across the District.
